Global CHRI Governing Structure

E-Governance will function in the same format as the General Assembly and the committees, but all the business and decision making will be made online in order to expand the process to a wider audience and remove barriers of time and location. Although all the global decision making is made online, the action and executions will be made locally by elected regional members.

Online environments include, but not limited to:

- * Debates
- * Elections
- * Policy
- * Events
- * Campaigns
- * Finance
- * Constitution

This forum will allow equal rights and access to all members regardless of their geographical location. E-Governance will make all global and organizational decision making in a one-member one-vote system. This structure will eliminate the concept of hierarchy amongst volunteers and will allow more participation from all members in a non traditional governing system.

The Board of Directors will function as a watchdog body over the E-Governance and their duty is to make sure the organization follows Canadian non-profit laws and the constitution.
